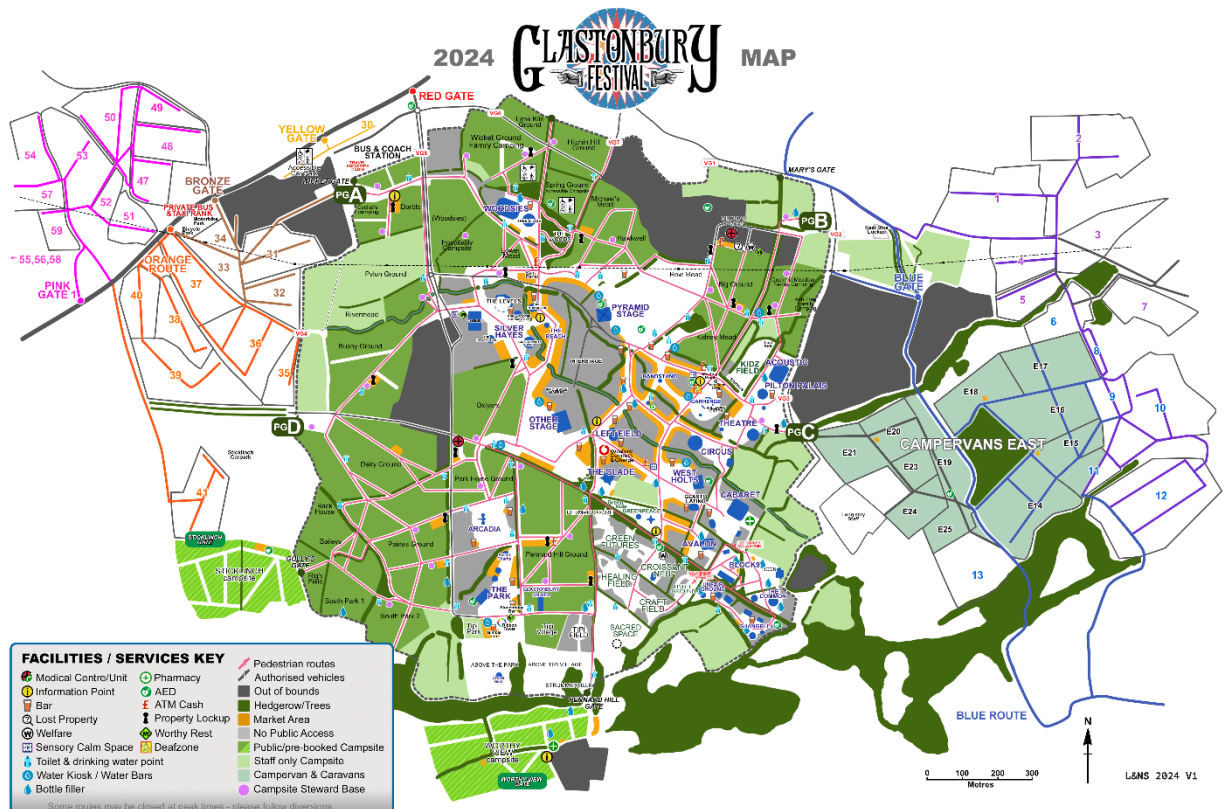
Useful information

Hi! We hope this email finds you filled with excitement and anticipation for this year's Glastonbury Festival. We can't wait to welcome you to the fields again.

First and foremost, we want to express our gratitude for choosing to book pre-pitched accommodation instead of bringing your own. By doing so, you have secured a hassle-free and comfortable experience that allows you to fully immerse yourself in the Festival's vibrant atmosphere whilst supporting the Festival in our efforts to reduce waste.

The site is already a buzzing hive of productivity, as hundreds of crew get to work transforming the dairy farm into a 900-acre Festival site (check out the BBC's live feed of the Festival build [here](#)) for another year of music, fun and unforgettable memories.

As we prepare for the festivities, we wanted to share some important information and updates to help you make the most of your stay at Sticklinch; this is your comprehensive guide on the arrival and check-in procedures, as well as the onsite facilities. Please share with the rest of your group, as only the Lead Booker will receive this email.

Arrival & check-in

Once within range (about 25 miles) tune into Worthy FM on 87.7 FM – it's good for traffic news both when you arrive and when you leave (and listen in to the morning show each day to find out what is happening on site).

Getting here

Sticklinch Campsite is situated on the west side of the Festival, adjacent to The Park and South Park I public camping areas. This location offers convenient accessibility with flat routes to the Festival, eliminating steep hills typically encountered in other areas such as Worthy View.

Car:

For those arriving by car who have pre-purchased Sticklinch parking, please follow the signs for Orange route. Follow the signs via the A361 from Glastonbury Town to reach the designated parking area.

Coach:

If you are arriving by coach, you will be dropped off at Pedestrian Gate A (North-West corner of the site). Enter the Festival on foot via Gate A and turn right, making your way directly South to Sticklinch Campsite (South-West corner of the site). You will pass the Pedestrian Gate D but should remain inside the Festival (follow signs to Sticklinch) and enter Sticklinch Campsite internally at 'Sticklinch Checkpoint'. You will need to show evidence of your Sticklinch booking to security teams on entry to the campsite and make your way to the "Pink Reception" to receive your supplementary Sticklinch Campsite wristband.

Drop-off:

DO NOT DROP OFF ON LOCAL ROADS OR NEAR VEHICLE GATES – IT IS DANGEROUS FOR PEDESTRIANS AND VEHICLES.

If you plan to be dropped off at the Festival, we offer a 24-hour Drop and Collect service, located on the A371 to the East of the site, with continuous bus transportation to and from the Festival via Gate A. Please do not arrive with large wheel barrows, wheelie bins or trollies as these will not be transported to the site.

Those that have used the Drop and Collect in the past have found the service to be excellent. There are serviced brick-built toilets as well as a burger van for those who need a bite to eat. The service will be available to the public starting from 07:00 on Wednesday, 26th June until 20:00 on Monday, 1st July.

When approaching the Festival from the A371 (heading towards Evercreech), please follow the signs for Drop and Collect or DC. We recommend planning a route that avoids the immediate Festival area, as the A361 is closed for through traffic on the Monday after the Festival between Glastonbury and Shepton Mallet.

Accreditation

Upon accreditation/check-in:

- Have your Festival ticket ready for inspection.
- Prepare to show photographic ID for all adult attendees.
- Present the confirmation email with your barcode.

Barcode and Ticket Presentation:

You will receive one barcode per booking, which can be used for the number of occupants specified in your tent. You may wish to print out the barcodes, as phone scanning can sometimes present issues. Please remember that the barcode does not replace your Festival tickets. You must present your Festival tickets upon arrival at Sticklinch. If you need to collect your ticket from the International Ticket Collection Cabin at Gate A, please do so before arriving at Sticklinch, as entry to Sticklinch requires a valid Festival ticket.

Group arrival:

Each member of your group should have their Festival ticket and a copy of the confirmation email with the barcode. If members of your group will be arriving separately, it is your responsibility as the lead booker to distribute the barcodes accordingly. However, for security reasons, we advise against unnecessary distribution. The barcode will allow entry for the maximum number of occupants specified in your booking. Once the barcode has been scanned the permitted number of times, additional entries will be denied.

Children's Attendance:

If you are bringing children aged 12 or under on 26th June 2024, please email us to ensure we have enough wristbands available at the gate.

Wristbands:

After verifying your ticket and barcode, you will first receive a Festival wristband, in exchange for your Festival ticket, followed by a Sticklinch wristband. It's important to note that Sticklinch wristbands will only be issued to the person presenting a valid Glastonbury Festival ticket along with the Sticklinch barcode. Wristbands will be placed on the ticket holder by the wristbanding team. We are unable to give multiple wristbands to the lead booker for distribution later. Please keep wristbands safe, as lost or damaged wristbands cannot be replaced.

As you proceed into Sticklinch, you will receive a Festival program to guide you through the event.

Checking in to your accommodation

Once you have passed through the Sticklinch gate (or Sticklinch checkpoint if you arrived on-foot via the main Festival site), the following options are available based on your chosen accommodation:

- For guests staying in Glastonbury Festival Scout tents or Glastonbury Bell tents, you will receive an email a couple of days prior to the Festival containing your tent number, row, and a map of the campsite. You may proceed directly to your assigned tent.
- Guests staying in Podpads, Bunkpads, or Bellepads should head to Green Reception.
- Tipis and Yurts can be found at Purple Reception.
- Bell tents are located between Yellow and Blue Receptions. Please refer to the email sent to you in the days before the Festival for specific information on which reception to visit.
- If none of the above apply to your accommodation, make your way to Pink Reception upon arrival. Our friendly team will be there to greet you and provide directions to your designated tent area and Sticklinch stewards will do their best to assist.

We will have a 24-hour check-in service at all receptions until Friday, although we kindly request that you arrive before 22:00 if possible. Pink Reception will remain open 24 hours throughout the Festival to address any issues that may arise.

Guidelines

We want you to have an amazing time at Sticklinch, but it's important to do so responsibly and consider the well-being of yourself and others. Here are some guidelines to ensure a pleasant experience for everyone...

Respect your neighbours

Please keep noise to a minimum, especially late at night.
Let's create a peaceful atmosphere on the campsite.

Dispose of waste properly

Make use of the litter and recycling bins provided.
Help us keep the campsite clean and tidy.

Wear your Sticklinch wristband

It's essential to keep your wristband on at all times.
This helps us identify campers and maintain a safe environment.

Use designated facilities

We have urinals and toilets available for your convenience.
Please utilise them for hygiene purposes.

Follow staff instructions

Our dedicated Sticklinch team is here to assist you.
Please adhere to their advice and instructions throughout your stay.

What to bring and what not to bring

Alcohol:

While you are allowed to bring your own alcohol to Sticklinch, we have some guidelines to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone:

- Please limit the amount of alcohol you bring to a reasonable quantity for personal consumption. This means no more than what you can carry in your hands upon your first arrival to the campsite.
- Glass is not permitted at Sticklinch for safety reasons and will be confiscated upon entry. Please transfer any alcoholic beverages into plastic or aluminium containers before arriving.
- We ask that you drink responsibly and stay within your limits. Look out for your friends and make sure everyone is enjoying the Festival safely.
- It's important to note that selling alcohol on the site or bringing excessive amounts will result in confiscation by security.

The Festival operates a 'Challenge 21' policy for alcohol sales, so please do not be offended if you are asked for proof of age when you buy alcohol or attempt to bring alcohol on to the site.

If you look under 21, you will not be served alcohol unless you can prove you are over 18 – by presenting ID, or by wearing a 'Challenge 21' wristband. These will be available from the property lock-ups, on presentation of a valid form of photo ID (UK Driving Licence, Valid Passport, or a [PASS ID](#)).

Drugs:

The use and distribution of illegal drugs is strictly prohibited. National drug enforcement laws apply on our site, and any drug offences will be dealt with by our security staff, in accordance with the law and guidelines, with the support of Avon & Somerset Police. Anyone found dealing or using illegal drugs will be evicted from the campsite and barred from entering the Festival.

We prioritise the well-being of all campers, and we want you to have a memorable and enjoyable time at Sticklinch. Experimenting with drugs can lead to adverse reactions. If you do take drugs and you become ill, depressed or frightened please ask a steward to direct you to one of the facilities on site, which can help and support you.

Not permitted at Sticklinch:

- Extra tents or gazebos
- Unauthorised trading
- Sound systems
- Fireworks, Chinese lanterns, flares, generators, weapons, or laser equipment
- Glass containers of any kind, including perfume bottles
- Illegal substances
- Animals (except guide dogs)
- Fires
- Smoking in enclosed public areas and your accommodation unit



Staying hydrated:

Water points with safe drinking water are available throughout the Festival site. Bring a reusable bottle to fill up as single-use plastic bottles are no longer sold. If you ordered a limited-edition Glastonbury Festival Chilly's water bottle, collect it from the Pink Reception or at the time of being issued with your Sticklinch wristband.

Bedding:

Canvas tents (Scout tents, Yurts, Bell tents, Tipi tents) do not include beds or bedding so please bring your own. Podpads and Bunkpads include beds and air mattresses, so you only need to bring bedding. Remember to take your bedding home after the Festival!

Campsite facilities

There's a range of food and drink outlets, toilets, showers, a pamper parlour, a 24 hour information point, 24-hour Security as well as helpful stewards.

First aid:

For non-emergency medical assistance, visit Park Home Medical Centre. Contact a steward or the Pink Reception for urgent medical attention in the campsite. NB. A portable de-fibrillator is available in emergencies from Pink Reception.

Mobile phone charging:

Sticklinch campsite does not have electrical sockets or phone charging facilities. Head to the Vodafone connect and charge in the main markets area for phone charging.

Keeping your stuff safe:

Property Lock-ups (marked on the map by a keyhole) are open 24 hours a day and are free of charge to use. As well as looking after your belongings, the Lock-ups also distribute toilet rolls free of charge.

The Lock-ups open at 08:00 on the Wednesday and close at 12 noon on the Monday – so if you leave anything in the Lock-ups make sure that you pick up your belongings before then.

Glastonbury offer some general tips on looking after your valuables whilst camping:

Write your postcode on valuables with a UV pen (available from the lock-ups).

Remember that tents are very vulnerable, even zipped up. Padlocks scream “I have something worth nicking in here”!

If you're worried about something being stolen, don't leave it in your tent.

Be inventive about hiding your money – and don't keep it all in one place.

Bear in mind that the most commonly lost items in the camping fields are keys, wallets, phones and cameras. Please keep them safe!

Toilets and hand-washing:

Sticklinch has a variety of toilets, including flushing vacuum toilets and compost loos - check the site plan that we send out nearer to the Festival with locations for the toilets in Sticklinch. Our 'top-tip' is “Give the compost toilets a go, they are great and may save you a wait for the vacuum units at peak times”.

Near the main toilet block, you'll find sink units with push taps where you can brush teeth, wash your face, and clean any pots & pans.

The sinks within the toilet trailers are for hand-washing only, so please don't use them to brush your teeth!

Showers:

Worthy View and Sticklinch Campsites are the only public campsites at the Festival which offer exclusive showers. Demand can be very high which can cause issues with water supply so these are some things to bear in mind:

- Some of the shower areas may have communal / semi-partitioned changing areas (and you may want to bring a bikini or swimming shorts if you don't want to shower in the nude!)
- The shower facilities themselves are separated into male and female shower units.
- We encourage everyone to prepare for the showers in the changing room to speed up the flow of people in the shower units themselves.
- Showers will be open a minimum of 07:00 – 14:00 and then 18:00 – 23:00.
- The queues are largest between 8:00am and 10:00am, so why not freshen up for the evening ahead instead?
- The water tanks need to refill and this can take a while so there can be some downtimes. Showering outside of peak hours is advisable.
- Please use water sparingly and try to stick to a 3-5 minute shower so everyone can enjoy the facilities.
- Embrace the Festival experience, take some time out from the usual routine, and go without a shower!

Pamper Parlour:

No need to weigh your bag down with hair dryers or hair straighteners as there are no electrical points. Instead, head to the Pamper Parlour which boasts new salon standard hair dryers, curlers and straighteners, all just waiting to help make you look fabulous!

Traders

All of our Traders offer Vegetarian, Vegan and Gluten/Dairy Free options, just ask! Not all dietary requirements can be covered but we hope there is something for everyone at Sticklinch. From breakfast baps, avocado on toast and croissants to ribs, wraps and waffles, there should be plenty of options for breakfast, lunch or dinner.

New for 2024 we are pleased to welcome a bar serving alcoholic tipples.

If you require camping supplies or general provisions, your nearest general store with limited camping supplies is at Pennard Hill, opposite the entrance to The Park. A dedicated camping shop can be found on the approach to Arcadia from Sticklinch.

Checking out

Remember your pledge and take all of your belongings - including any unwanted camping equipment! Bag up any rubbish in black/clear bags and leave any waste in the recycling pens. Please vacate the campsite on the morning of Monday 1st July - the campsite will be closed at 12 noon.



We want you to have a memorable and enjoyable time at Sticklinch. Our best tip is to say hello to your neighbours to build a community feeling and provide greater security. Look after each other and if someone is feeling ill, find the help of one of our lovely team members.
